Counselor's Corner

As I write this, Rhoda and I are praying that God will continue to grant life and health to the grandchildren in our daughter and daughter-in-law's wombs. As you read this, Lord willing, we will have celebrated or will soon celebrate the births and baptisms of two grandsons. Yes we know now, during pregnancy, that both babies are boys. There is one difference however. One grandson's name is decided. It's a done deal. Our son and his wife have put his initials on the wall of the nursery. Our daughter and her husband though are still thinking. They have their list, have had their discussions, but have yet to decide on the right name for their son. Or is that an incorrect way to think of it? Is there a "right" name for their son? I think not. Whichever name they pick from their list will be a name that our family will grow to love and associate with God's precious gift.

That was not the case with Joseph and Mary. They too, knew they would have a son. God, their child's true Father, told them so and then immediately He made unnecessary any lists and discussions about their son's name. In this case, there was a right name. It was not because it sounded right but simply because it WAS right. "You shall call His Name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." (Matthew 1:21) Jesus means, "The Lord Saves," and by His perfect life, substitutionary death and victorious resurrection, Jesus lived up to His Name.

By the working of the Holy Spirit, "Jesus" is the right name for us to hear and to use. When Satan accuses you, tell yourself and him that his accusations cannot stick, for you have been baptized into the Name of Jesus. When guilt wears on you, believe the absolution that you have heard and received in the Name of Jesus. When troubles surround you, take them directly to the Father in the Name of Jesus to make your prayers acceptable and answered. When enemies attack the church, look ahead to the day when

ARCHIVIST-HISTORIAN

What are the responsibilities of an archivist-historian? This is a position that isn't very well known for its duties. Examining the definition of the dual word, we find that archivist means preserving articles of historical value and historian collects or records the items to be preserved. Regardless of what organization you are serving as a historian, whether it is a congregation, church organization, or secular organization, the following are basic guidelines of what to save, what to toss, and what to pass on.

What to save items are signed executive board and regular meeting minutes. These include handouts at meetings, elected and appointed officer reports, printed material from special meetings, biennium reports, newsletters, photographs identified, and photo copy of newspaper clippings.

What to toss are unidentified photos, multiple copies of officer reports and newspaper clippings after they have been photo-copied.

What to pass on to the next person taking your position are officer reports to the board of directors, files from preceding terms, documents reflecting any actions that affect the workings of your position and updated set of guidelines for your position, including all actions required of your position that are not specifically mentioned in the by-laws.

These guidelines, especially what to pass on, should be helpful for any office that you hold in any organization.


